GSP MATTERS FOR NEBRASKA


The Generalized System of Preferences (GSP) program allows U.S. companies to import certain products duty free from developing countries. In 2012, GSP eliminated tariffs on nearly \$20 billion worth of imports and saved American companies \$750 million, including those in Nebraska.

Yet GSP expires on July 31, 2013 and Congress must pass legislation to renew GSP for Nebraska companies to continue receiving these benefits.

NEBRASKA COMPANIES IMPORTING GSP-ELIGIBLE GOODS



NEBRASKA'S GSP IMPORTS BY PRODUCT TYPE


Most Nebraska imports under GSP are raw materials and industrial goods whose duty-free treatment helps Nebraska companies remain competitive.





NEBRASKA'S GSP IMPORTS BY SOURCE COUNTRY

GSP eliminates tariffs on certain products from more than 130 countries, but the vast majority of Nebraska imports under GSP come from a handful of countries, led by India, Thailand, and Turkey.



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
