GSP MATTERS FOR NEW YORK

The Generalized System of Preferences (GSP) program allows U.S. companies to import certain products duty free from developing countries. In 2012, GSP eliminated tariffs on nearly \$20 billion worth of imports and saved American companies \$750 million, including those in New York.

Yet GSP expires on July 31, 2013 and Congress must pass legislation to renew GSP for New York companies to continue receiving these benefits.

NEW YORK COMPANIES IMPORTING GSP-ELIGIBLE GOODS





Many New York imports under GSP are chemicals and industrial goods whose duty-free treatment helps New York companies remain competitive.


New York's GSP Imports, 2012
