Who Benefits from GSP? Everyone! *The tariff savings from GSP are spread throughout the economy, to the tune of nearly \$1 billion in 2007. While many people think that imports just help lower prices for consumers (a good thing, no doubt!), consumer goods accounted for less than 20 percent of imports under GSP in 2007.*

The biggest users of the GSP program are actually U.S. manufacturers, who benefited from duty-free treatment for industrial supplies, raw materials, and capital goods worth more than \$20 billion in 2007, or 65 percent of total imports under the GSP program.
